### Principals report continued...

Part of the movement from being a child to being an adult is the transition from Year 6 into Year 7 and high school. This is a big change from many students going from one teacher and one classroom to a whole range of teachers in different lessons and different classrooms each lesson. Ms Shannan Campbell has made this change easier to deal with and will be Year 7 Advisor for 2014. She has organised a fantastic transition program with the assistance of Year 6 teachers and many of our high school teachers. The program has run successfully across one week and students have enjoyed getting to know the new system of moving around classes and having different teachers. The teachers have also enjoyed getting to know the year 6 students that they are likely to be teaching next year. I think the highlight for many was a lunch for parents, students and staff prepared by students helped by Mrs Morris and Miss O'Donoghue on Thursday

Parents are a really big part of a child's education and as a school we often try and contact parents to let them know if there is a problem or a concern regarding their child or to pass on positive information about their child's progress. It is vitally important that all contact details are updated regularly and that if you change your address or your phone number that you contact the school as soon as possible so that we can keep our records accurate in case we need to contact you. It is also important to keep emergency contacts up-to-date. A few times last week we were unable to contact parents. We tried emergency contact numbers and in each case the person who had been identified as an emergency contact had either changed their number or was no longer in a position to assist in emergencies. Fortunately neither of these cases was urgent and, later on, we were able to reach the parents.

We have worked very hard this year to develop an accurate role marking system to keep track of student absences. This is a legal requirement of all schools and attendance information is often sought by a range of government departments. Attendance information can also be important to parents and students who are seeking employment or receive a government benefit as many of these benefits are only payable if attendance requirements are met.

As the data from our rolls has become more easily obtained and studied it is becoming increasingly obvious that many students have large numbers of absences that are not explained. It is very important that if your child is away from school that they bring a note from you explaining the absence the following day so that the roll can be adjusted and reduce problems later on. You can also ring the school to explain an absence. Many people do this the morning the student is absent and others the following day.

If you know you're going to be away for a range of reasons including; family reasons, illness or medical treatment it is possible to be granted exemption from school. This means the number of absences recorded for your child throughout the year will be reduced. To seek an exemption it is best to contact the school before the student is away if possible.




