Dr Moore delivered a presentation about the work of Archaeologists, showed digs he had been involved with around the world and discussed his passion for the discipline to students from Years 9 - 12.

The students were then given an opportunity to create and use stone tools with Dr Moore's instruction; a field in which he is a recognised expert, and discuss with his students details of the experiences studying and working in this field.

Dr Moore and his associates will be conducting site studies of the Narran Lakes, an area he claims contains a wealth of archaeological Indigenous artefacts, for the next two years. It is hoped that many more students from LRCS will be able to get involved during this time.












STEM Aquaponics Excursion
