Our primary students are attending 90% of the time, and our secondary students 87%. This sounds great because there are many students who attend 98% of the time and are therefore getting a consistent and high quality education. Unfortunately, some students have very poor attendance and consequently their results are very poor. Because of this, they will struggle to cope with learning in 2018 and probably have more days off because they are struggling with classwork. This cycle continues, because of their absences, they leave school with very low marks and a very difficult future in front of them for the rest of their lives.

As parents, you are responsible for getting your kids to school every day. If you do not you are letting them down and they could be disadvantaged for the rest of their lives.

I look forward to seeing every student at school every day possible next year. This is the most important thing we can do for our kids because as we have shown over and over again.........





Journey Sticks

S3Culgoa have been working hard over the last 10 weeks creating their own Journey Sticks. Students collected sticks and or branches from around the Lightning Ridge area to create their own personalised journey sticks.

With help from Aunty Brenda and Rhonda Ashby students explored ways to decorate their sticks detailing their life journeys. Mr Murray allowed S3Culgoa to use the woodwork room to cut and sand the sticks and then students painted the sticks detailing differentsymbols relating to events that have taken part in their life journey so far.

History of journey sticks

First, a little background on the journey stick for you. Aboriginal people in Australia used journey sticks to more easily recount their journeys to other people upon their return. They found a large walking stick, collected materials found along the way, and tied them to the stick in chronological order.

Native Americans also decorated sticks to recount their journeys and tell about their travels. These sticks can be used as storytelling and navigational tools. The collected materials and markings have various purposes. Some things can be used as markers for natural features in the land, such as tree bark to indicate passing through the woods. While particular symbols carved into or painted onto the stick could show weather patterns, natural features, or events that took place.







Float Parade 2018 Entry Terms and Conditions

- The Float Parade is an event organised and arranged by the Lightning Ridge Easter Festival Committee (LREFC) which is a subcommittee of the Lightning Ridge Tourism Association (LRTA)
- The Float Parade will take place rain or shine unless called off by the LREFC whose decision to run or cancel the event will be final
- 3. Entry to the Float Parade is \$20
- 4. If you enter the competition, you will be allocated a float number. It is important that this number is displayed obviously at the commencement of the parade otherwise you may miss out on being judged
- There is no limit to the number of floats in the parade unless the LREFC makes a maximum limit at their discretion
- 6. The Float Parade will commence at approximately 1.30pm on Sunday 1st April 2018 and participants are asked to move to their allocated position no later than 1pm. Commencement time will depend upon other events finishing so may start earlier or later than the scheduled time. There will be two staging points one starting from the corner of Morilla and Brilliant Streets and stretching back to Gem Street and the second on Opal Street on the corner of Harlequin and stretching fivd into Opal St. The parade organiser will discuss your starting position with you before the event takes place
- 7. The float parade will proceed at walking pace along Morilla St with Opal St entrants joining the parade by intersecting with other floats as directed at the cross road by appointed traffic controller and finishes in Onyx Street parking area of the Pub (LR Outback Resort). Parade will be followed by presentation of prizes on outdoor stage/beer garden of outback resort. Floats will be judged at the commencement and during the parade by volunteer judges picked by the parade organiser
- 8. Prizes will be awarded as follows: 1st Prize \$300, 2nd Prize \$200, 3nd Prize \$100
- The judge's decision will be final and the judging sheets will be destroyed after the prizes are awarded. Prizes will be provided in eash
- Participants will provide proof of age if requested
- 11. Under no circumstances will the organisers be bound to contact a participant by mobile phone or other form of electronic communication. All details will be discussed and resolved prior to the parade commencing





Active Kids Rebate Program

What is the Active Kids Rebate program?

The NSW Government will provide a rebate through a voucher system to parents/guardians of school enrolled children. The \$100 voucher can be used for registration and participation costs for sport and fitness activities.

The initiative will reduce the barriers to participation and help change the physical activity behaviours of children and young people in NSW. The majority of children and adolescents in NSW are not meeting the daily recommended levels of physical activity. In 2015, more than 1 in 5 children in NSW was overweight or obese.

Who is eligible to claim the voucher?

Every family in NSW with a child enrolled in school from Kindergarten to year 12 will be eligible for the Active Kids Rebate. It will not be means tested and one voucher will be available for every child in the family annually over the next four years. There will be no limits on the number of applications per family, as long as every child is enrolled in school.

What can the voucher be used for?

The voucher can be used for registration or membership fees for after-school, weekend sport and structured physical activity programs, including swimming lessons, from a wide range of providers. The vouchers will be redeemable through approved sport, fitness and physical activity providers upon registration.

Who will administer the program?

The Office of Sport will work in partnership with Treasury and Service NSW to implement the systems required to enable families to access their voucher through an on-line process. The Office of Sport will work closely with approved sport, fitness and physical activity providers to support the largely volunteer workforce in implementing streamlined systems to allow users to redeem their vouchers upon registration.

When will the program be introduced?

From January 2018 families will be able to claim their voucher/s online from the NSW Government.

Where can I find more information?

Applications will be facilitated by the Office of Sport. More information will be available on the website as the program details are further developed www.sport.nsw.gov.au/activekids

Yuwaalaraay is connected linguistically to Gamilaraay, the language of the Gamilaroi/Kamilaroi people.

The language area extends across north west NSW on the Barwon River into south west Queensland along the Narran, Culgoa and Balonne Rivers. This area takes in the communities of Hebel, Dirranbandi, and St George, extending south towards Goodooga, Walgett, Lightning Ridge and Collarenebri.
