Primary Deputy Principal's Report

As Term 3 draws to an end, planning for next term and 2021 commences. To say it has been a challenge for the whole school community is an understatement. Everyone complying with NSW Government and Department of Education's COVID policies and plans has made our school systems run smoothly, and I congratulate everyone.

Currently, adults who aren't essential to school are not permitted on LRCS site, so parents and families are still not allowed to come into the school grounds except to purchase from the Uniform Shop (Monday and Thursday 8.30am-9.00am only).

Hopefully, the following questions and answers may help families.

Question: I want to speak to my child's teacher.

Answer: You can contact the school requesting a meeting and it can be organised via a phone call or at a mutually agreed time in the front office, adhering to COVID social distancing procedures.

Question: What about Primary assemblies?

Answer: At this stage, they can only be held for 15 minutes, with teachers socially distancing. Parents and families cannot attend at the moment.

Question: What about Presentation Assembly at the end of the year?

Answer: LRCS will comply with NSW Health and Department of Education's (DoE) advice and guidelines. Hopefully, rules will be relaxed by then. We will advise the community as soon as we know.

Question: What about the 2 week swimming scheme that happens every year? Answer: Due to COVID restrictions, this program will not be occurring this year. There is a swimming program being offered by The Royal Life Saving Society of NSW, to all students over the Christmas holidays that families may wish to participate in. That program is not an LRCS program.

Question: What about the Opal Pool Party at the end of the year?

Answer: Again, we will have to wait and see if there are any changes in DoE guidelines. We will advise you as soon as we know.

Stage 1 Report

Stage 1



During Term 3, students have also been rotating through the Stage 1 classes and completing STEM (Science Technology Engineering Maths) activities. The STEM activities have included programming and coding with Mr Delhaas, Engineering construction with Mrs Slater and computer skills with Mr Britts. The students have embraced the opportunity to explore, create and problem solve during these lessons.



MC1P Bumblebees

This term for Visual Arts, we have recently completed our portable travel game– *Birrguu Matya a*lso called *Ngaka Ngaka* which means look look. Similar to tic-tac-toe and designed to develop skill, patience and lateral thinking. This game has been played by Aboriginal people for centuries. Students tie-dyed their pieces of cloth, hand painted the board game, designed and produced hand made clay marker stones. Each student learnt how to make small pouches and plaited ties to keep their games in a small handy pouch. Loads of fun, well done class and a special thanks to our fantastic School Learning Support Officer (SLSO) Jacquelyn James.

















The object of the game is to get your three stones in a row before your opponent. You can win diagonally, vertically or horizontally. Starting with an empty cloth, each player takes turns placing down one of their stones.

Both players are simultaneously complete their line of three while blocking their opponent.

Phase two of the game begins when all the pieces are laid down and no one has positioned three in a row. At this stage, players take turns moving their stones one square at a time in any direction, provided the square is vacant. You cannot skip a move and you cannot lift a stone and jump.

Secondary Studies

Food Technology

This term Years 9 & 10 Food Technology students designed and produced cup cakes for their assessment task. Each student chose a theme that reflected a *special occasion*. Some of the themes included Easter, Valentine's Day, Dia de Muertos (Mexican Day of the Dead) and Australia Day.



Secondary Studies

STEM

The Year 7 STEM class have been busy this year completing units on renewable energies, candle making and H2O rockets. The classes have also been given some engineering tasks using a minimum of equipment and devising solutions for bridge building, towers, parachute and gyrocopters. The students are starting a unit on recycling water, learning about the Artesian Basin and water purifying.





Industrial Technology and Design Technology

In Stage 5 the students have been busily completing projects in Metalwork and Design Technology. The metalwork students have just completed a folding BBQ plate or Motorcycle stand and are gaining skills in fabrication of joints using SHS. Some students have also started using the metal lathe to produce a hammer. The Design and Technology students have recently completed an Innovation assessment and Ipod project, the class is now producing a pen project on the wood lathe. Classes are also completing tool boxes and bedside tables.



Year 12 Construction

On a cold August morning, our Year 12 Construction students (Trent Hawkins and Keenan Middleton) spent the day being assessed on their mortar mixing and block construction skills. Trent and Keenan have been working under the supervision of Mr David Pickard, but were assessed by Ms Leisa Rowlands, Technology Teacher at Trundle High School.

Trent and Keenan's progress has been monitored under the Western Access Program, whereby Leisa spent two days with the boys. Once their blockwork was completed they went into the workshops, where they were assessed on the carpentry and joinery skills, and the extensive theory testing. Leisa is a knowledgeable and enthusiastic teacher and the boys worked really hard for the two days.

Just down from the Lunar was the Clear Water part of the Narran Lake, it was unfortunate that we were not able to see the other area but it surely was fantastic place to be at. Along the lake there were black swans, pelicans and ducks. The water that flows into the lake is from the Ballone up at St George. After we saw the lake we paced a rock at this special stone monument, the rocks were placed in a way to resemble the *Garriya* (crocodile).

COVID-19 safe expectations of students

This information will assist students understand the COVID-19 safe arrangements in place when attending their HSC examination. The safety and wellbeing of students and staff in attendance is of paramount importance to us and as such we ask all students to cooperate with these arrangements at all times.

Screening for students with symptoms

- Students must not attend the exam if they are unwell
- Students will be asked upon arrival if they have any flu-like symptoms or if they should be in self-isolation under direction by NSW Health
- Students displaying flu-like symptoms or who advise they are unwell will be asked to leave the school and arrange to have a COVID-19 test
- Students with a clinical history/known illness that may appear like COVID-19 symptoms should be planning now and speak to their doctor/GP. The GP can provide written assurance e.g. symptom the student presents on a normal basis.

Flu-like symptoms

Flu-like symptoms include fever, cough, sore throat, shortness of breath, loss of taste, and loss of smell. Additional information about COVID-19 symptoms can be found on the <u>NSW</u> <u>Health website</u>.

Students who are displaying even mild flu-like symptoms should leave immediately and not return until they have a negative COVID-19 test and are symptom-free.

Fast track COVID-19 test results

HSC students can fast-track their COVID-19 test results.

To do this you must:

- say you are a HSC student when taking a test
- ensure the nurse or doctor doing the test marks your referral 'urgent HSC'
- self-isolate until a negative result is received
- show your school the negative result
- call the contact number provided by the clinic if results are not received within 36 hours.

Minimising the risk of transmission

- Students should wash their hands or use hand sanitiser prior to commencing the exam.
- Maintain good personal hygiene practices during the exam including covering your cough or sneeze through coughing or sneezing into your elbow or a tissue, disposing of tissues at the end of the exam.
- Avoid shaking hands or hugging other students on exam days.
- Hygiene supplies will be available at all exam venues
 - o Sanitiser
 - o Wipes.

- Student may wipe down their table before they begin their exam if they choose to.
- Students should not mingle in large groups prior to or after the exam.
- Exam rooms will be cleaned each day.

Arrival and sign-on arrangements

- Students should arrive no more than 20 minutes prior to the exam and report directly to the designated exam room for screening and sign-on.
- Students will be asked to sign an attendance sheet confirming attendance at the exam, providing contact details and that they do not have flu-like symptoms.

Alternative Examination Locations

Your school has identified an alternative examination location in the event that the examination is unable to proceed in the planned location. This information will be provided to you on your personal examination timetable so it is readily available at short notice in case it is required.

This is a backup only and students should attend the planned location unless advised by the school. Do not attend a proposed alternative location if you have not been told to do so by the school.

Confirmed cases of COVID-19

If during the examination period the school is advised by NSW Health that there has been a confirmed case of COVID-19 which will impact the school, arrangements are in place to minimise disruption where possible. The school may advise you the day before that the examination will be relocated to the alternative venue detailed in your timetable or the exam may be cancelled.

Illness/Misadventure

Students who do not attend an exam due to having symptoms, or who are turned away as a result of screening will be eligible for an illness/misadventure claim. Your school will assist you through this process where required.

Gastroenteritis

Symptoms

Diarrhoea, vomiting, fever, stomach cramps and headaches.

Home or school?

Keep home from school for 24 hours until diarrhoea/vomiting stops.

Influenza

Symptoms

Sudden onset fever, runny nose, sore throat cough, muscle aches and headaches.

Home or school?

Keep home from school until well.



Knowing whether a child is well enough to go to school can be tough for any parent.



Never send a child to school who has a fever, is vomiting or nauseated, or has diarrhoea.
