### **Principal's Report**

So begins my last newsletter of the 2022 school year and what a year it has been. Thankfully, the year was not interrupted by Covid inspired disrupted learning. While no

school, including ours, is perfect, we have continued to strive to provide your children with the best possible educational opportunities throughout 2022.

This year, we have made some curriculum innovations in Secondary, including dedicated Literacy, Numeracy and Wellbeing classes. The latter will not continue in 2023, because student and staff feedback suggested that it was not having the required impact.

The signs for the Literacy and Numeracy are far more positive, but the impact of these lessons will be evaluated at the end of 2023.

Secondary Clubs have been a success and will continue in 2023.

In Primary, students have continued to be provided with high quality lessons, but in the last semester, we have introduced a literacy intervention program called MacqLit, which has proven to be successful for many students.

There have been many highlights in 2022, too many to mention in this article, however, there are a few that I would like to mention specifically: NAIDOC Week is always an important week for the whole school community, and once again we came together during this week to celebrate Aboriginal culture and acknowledge our shared history under the theme, "Get Up! Stand Up! Show Up!" It was truly a magnificent week and a clear demonstration of what a community can do when they work together.

Last Wednesday, CAPA night was also a fine example of school and community working together. Some 250 students were involved, as were 68 staff. It was a great celebration of the talents of our students and staff. It was also a fine example of what collaboration and teamwork can do. To that end, I would like to thank all staff, students and parents who supported this event, but particularly, the leadership provided by our Business Manager - Kelly Morriss, Music Teacher - Lucas Schembri, Visual Arts Teacher - Priscilla Martinez and community volunteer - Andrea Marsh-Babic.
