During the next two weeks students will continue their learning in classes up until Friday 16th December. This includes arriving on time to school, in school uniform and ready to learn with books and pens every day.


There are some rewards planned for those students who have consistently displayed our PBL values of Respect, Responsibility & Pride, information about these rewards will be


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Respect has been a topic for discussion at our weekly assemblies. Gradually students are becoming more comfortable using the Zones of Regulation language,


Stage 1

We are developing our Chicken breeding program to produce Show quality pure bred birds which can be exhibited in the local Agricultural shows. Thank you to Mr Schembri for supplying us with Hamburg eggs which we have now with our Silkie and Vorwerk breeds. We have also upgraded our chicken housing to improve the health and biosecurity responsibilities of our breeding flock.

Primary Industries students have completed a unit on fencing with construction of a temporary electric fence on the school oval. They are currently wrapping up a unit on Weather in Primary production and have been collecting daily data on the weather for Lightning Ridge and comparing it with weather forecasts. Very relevant at the moment they have been exploring the impact of extreme weather events on our local primary production.
