#### **Secondary Deputy Principal's Report**

As mentioned in the previous newsletter, during week 5 students in Years 7 to 10 will be sitting their Yearly Examinations. The information gathered from the Yearly Examinations will then be combined with class work and assessment tasks to inform our teachers regarding students achievements, this information will then be included in their reports. It is imperative that all students put in 100% effort to their exams.

Students have been working towards completing their VALID 8 online exam. This test is mandatory for NSW Government schools and tests are marked externally, results will be sent to parents and the school. This is a diagnostic tool to assist in improving student outcomes in science and as a tool for program evaluation. The test is linked to the science syllabus and assesses what students know and can do in science. It also provides useful information about student attitudes towards science.

Check-in assessment testing has been completed, it is pleasing that most students put in 100% effort into these tests in reading and numeracy for students in Years 7,8 & 9. The assessment can supplement existing school practices to identify how students are performing in literacy and numeracy and to help teachers tailor their teaching more specifically to student needs.

Most students follow our PBL values of Respect, Responsibility & Pride. Students follow instructions and attend all classes, they speak in a polite manner to their peers and staff, they apply themselves towards their classwork. Unfortunately, we have a small group of students who are struggling to follow these

values, they have been counselled about their inappropriate behaviour. This kind of behaviour is unacceptable at LRCS.

Currently staff are trialling a system to record the number of students wearing uniform, so that we can reward them for showing pride in our school. Students are required to wear plain black shorts, a red, black & white shirt or a plain white collared shirt or the new senior red & black shirts. Tights are not part of our uniform and should be used after school or on weekends.




Yuwaalaraay is the dialect of the Lightning Ridge area. The name of the language and Aboriginal people of the Balonne River Region.

It aims to develop resilience and shift student dependency to empowering attitudes and initiative.










#### **English**

From the timeless works of Jack Davis to the fresh and insightful pieces crafted by 21st-century playwrights, we've delved into the heart of these narratives, exploring unique Australian perspectives and societal commentary. Our discussions have been engaging, and our insights have deepened our understanding of the distinctive storytelling techniques in Australian drama. Plus, we've had a blast playing drama games, bringing our studies to life in creative and interactive ways.



Jack Davis (1917 - 2000)



In 10M English, we have been immersing ourselves in Debra Oswald's 2003 play, Skate. The play is set in a small, remote town in NSW very similar to Lightning Ridge, and it deals with issues and challenges that our students can relate to. As it is a play, we are also studying concepts and techniques used by playwrights, directors, and actors to engage the audience and help them connect with the characters and storyline.

Our new Year 12 cohort has begun their studies in English Standard by looking at representations of human experiences in texts. Specifically, we have studied Christopher Kezelos's short film Zero, a tale of discrimination and resilience. The central character, Zero, faces unjust societal treatment due to arbitrary labels, however, his unwavering determination in the face of adversity showcases the strength of the human spirit. Be sure to have a conversation with your children about the power of this short text!
