### **PRINCIPAL'S REPORT**

Welcome back to all of our students!

I enjoyed the grins and waves on those first days back as students passed through the Kaolin Street gates. It was great to greet them all and see their smiling faces as they entered the school grounds for the first time in 2024. Impressive was the sheer number of students in uniform. Primary looked splendid in their red shirts while secondary students were beaming in their new black and red shirts.

Much research has gone into the new uniforms with a view to making them more "washer friendly" and more comfortable on warmer days. While there is a two-year period of transition to the new uniform which means that Primary and secondary students can continue to wear the tricolour shirts, from what was seen in the first week, the transition will not take nearly that long.

If your secondary student has returned their Uniform note you will by now have been issued with two free shirts. Of course in issuing those shirts free of charge there is an expectation that your child will wear school uniform every day and that expectation extends to them wearing black shorts or slacks.

Uniform has a number of benefits, it allows staff to identify visitors more easily and it also gives students a greater sense of belonging and ownership of their school. We will be celebrating those students who wear uniform and there will be incentives for doing so.

We cannot teach our students if they are not at school. To take full advantage of the opportunities our school offers all students need to attend every day unless they are ill. Attendance is the most basic necessity for success at school so I ask that all parents and carers send their students to school every, illness not withstanding. If your child is absent please notify the school in writing, via text or by phoning to provide a reason for their absence.

Welcome back to Lightning Ridge Central for 2024.

Secondary classes start at 8:40am each day, we have implemented systems for those students who arrive late to school. At LRCS our goal is to establish routines for our students and get them ready

for the world of work. One very important criteria in the world of work is arriving to work on time, if staff are not on time to work they may be impacted by a reduction in pay or even suspended from work, in other words fired. Our goal is to teach our students that they need to arrive on time now they are at school so when they do leave school arriving to work on time is second nature. When students arrive late to school they are missing out on valuable information and learning activities.

The very successful whole school swimming carnival held last week was a fantastic event in which many of our students displayed their swimming skills and awesome sportsmanship. The YONDR program continues into 2024, this supports the NSW Governments policy of no mobile phones in schools. All secondary students will be issued with new YONDR pouches shortly. The use of the YONDR pouches has already had an impact on our students learning. Staff are spending less time on directing students away from their devices and more time on teaching, students are able to be more engaged in their learning. The difference in the playground is noticeable with students more engaged in conversation and playing sport than trying to use their phones. Parents MUST contact the front office if they need a message be passed onto their child.

At times some parents have messaged or called their child whilst they are in class this results in the disruption of the entire class and may result in severe consequences for the student.

A Meet & Greet was held on Tuesday 20th, this was a wonderful opportunity for teachers and parent to meet in an informal setting, a sausage sizzle was made available thanks to the P&C.

## **Secondary Studies**

#### Year 11 Primary Industries

This Term for Primary Industries Year 11 are developing their knowledge in work health and safety processes.
